WORDS OF WISDOM

THE DEMANDS OF DISCIPLESHIP

Today we encounter readings that already have a Lenten feel about them. Nineveh undergoes a forty-day fast, the psalmist reminds us that God alone can show sinners the way, Paul shows us how fleeting the things and events of this world are, and Jesus cries out "Repent!" before he calls his new followers. "Come after me," Jesus says, but if we are to truly live out the commands and demands of our discipleship through baptism, we must first know our need for conversion, our repentance, our need to believe in the gospel fully. Today's Gospel opens with the stark reminder of what befell John the Baptist for completely living out his vocation as the herald of Christ and the gospel: he was arrested, imprisoned, and martyred. Though few of us will experience consequences that extreme, we must all be ready to risk some sort of rejection as, heeding the call of Jesus, we live out the kingdom of God at hand, repent of our sins, and believe in the good news of salvation.

The World in its Present Form is Passing Away.

1 Corinthians

Dear Friends,

I have prepared a report of our income and expenses for the calendar year 2017. This is a report that shows the amount of money that came in for our operations and the expenses that were covered with the same. As you will notice, the major income is the offertory collections, which is the main source of revenue for the parish. The other operating revenue is money received through other offerings like candles or donations. These are the two main categories of income that support the expenses of the parish. The ideal situation would be that with these two we would be able to cover all the expenses, because the other sources of income are very small amounts. If we add up those two categories, we get a total of \$ 349,233.08. With our expenses totaling \$370,527.75, we are in the red by \$ 21,294.67. This means that we are raising only 94.253% of what we need to operate the parish and so that is a shortfall of 5.746%. But when we add also the other income categories, the deficit goes down a little to 5.136%

Our total income in 2016 was \$ 358,751.96, while in 2017 it was down by \$7,940.34. This means that our income in 2017 was 97.786% of the previous year. This could be due to the fact that we had the fund raising for the air conditioning project. On the expense side, it was \$364,472.47 in 2016 and for 2017 this works out to 101.469% of the previous year. Our income has gone down while the expense has gone up. What can we do to bridge this gap? There are only two options: reduce our expenses or increase our income. Our expenses are greatly controlled and there isn't much we can do to reduce further the expenses and so the only option for us is to increase our income. If we look at the expenses and divide it by 52, it will give us the weekly income needed to cover the expenses. What we needed weekly in 2016 was \$7009.08 and in 2017 was \$7112.09. In 2018 the expenses will again go up. We do not know how much but we can only go by the numbers that are available to us. So, a reasonable projection would be that for 2018 we would need \$380,923.61, which is 3% more than the expenses from 2017. This means that we need \$ 7,325.45 each week for 2018. I shall leave it to each one to decide what to do, whether to increase their weekly offering or start contributing something to the building fund which will bring up our reserve fund

from which we cover the shortfall for the year.

These expenses do not reflect major expenses like the replacement of the sign, which should take place soon, or major repairs or upgrade to the building. All such expenses are made from our reserve building fund. I am also anticipating that the replacement of our air conditioner will cost much more than what we have raised for the project. The Finance Committee and the Pastoral Council have started working together to get this project implemented without causing much downtime for the church. I shall keep you updated as things begin to move. Right now, we are trying to select an MEP engineering consultant who can work on the initial steps of the project.
