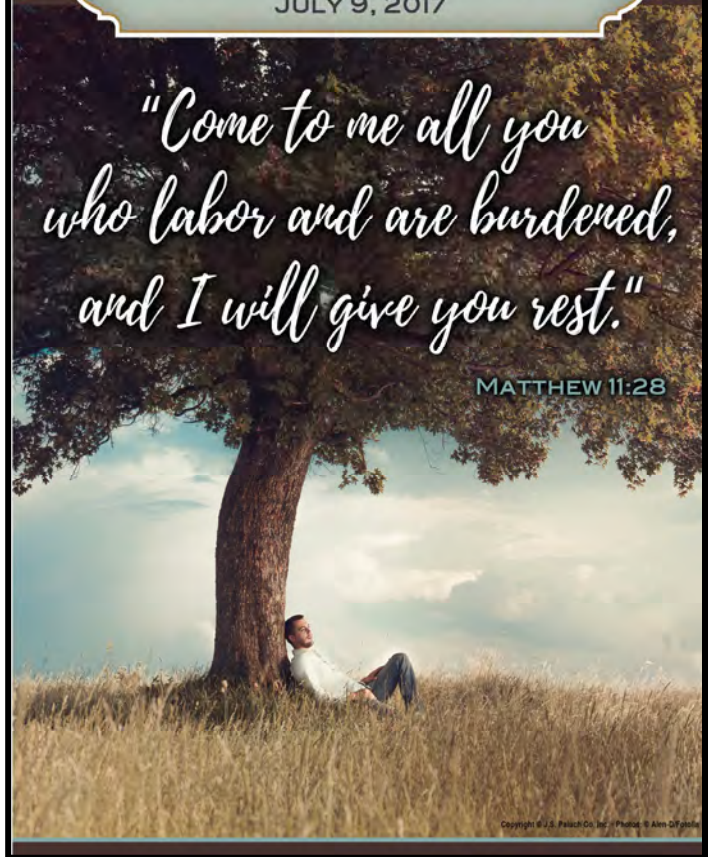

THE WORD THIS WEEK

I am gentle and humble of heart

Today's Gospel in an answer to a very simple question: who is this Jesus we follow? What is he like? He tells us himself: he is gentle, and humble of heart. There is a simplicity about this Gospel which speaks very clearly to tired hearts. Indeed, it is often the case that we overlook the simplicity of the Gospel message - which is why it is valuable to be as children, constantly wondering and marveling at the beauty and fascination of Jesus. How much God must love us: the message of salvation is so easy to receive, the promise is so welcome. This is a Sunday to wallow in the wonder of a God who is kind and full of compassion.

A Voice for Catholic Indians: The Birth of The Bureau of Catholic Indian Missions

At a moment when the vice president of the United States, the speaker of the House of Representatives, and six of the nine justices of the Supreme Court are Catholic, it may be hard to imagine a time when Catholics were not only a small percentage of the population, but a marginalized one as well. For example, in the 1850s, only five percent of Americans were Catholic. Today, it's 25 percent. But more importantly, in the late 19th Century, Catholics had little representation in the seats of power.



Catholic Negro American Mission Board

From its beginning, the Catholic Negro American Mission Board has provided for the needs of African American Catholics. Spreading the Gospel among African American communities was a chief concern of then-Father John Carroll, at the time Prefect Apostolic of the United States and later to become the nation's first bishop.

The monetary costs of Catholic ministry in the face of segregation and discrimination became too much for the Commission for the Catholic Missions and its national collection to handle on its own. To raise the profile of evangelization work by and among African American Catholics, the bishops elected to establish the Catholic Negro American Mission Board at New York City in 1907.
